Eligible Sites

- Known or suspected soil or groundwater contamination
- MPCA-approved RAP for Cleanup Grant applicants
- End use which will create jobs, taxes, or other public benefits
- Own or have access to property
- Resolution from applicant body and municipality (if different)

Investigation - Phase I, Phase II, RAP Development	Project/Grant Administration
Cleanup - Contaminated soil removal and disposal, vapor barriers, groundwater treatment, etc.	Appraisal or other application costs
Public Acquisition*	Development Costs
Environmental Consulting Fees*	Asbestos Abatement in Buildings
Public Improvements*	Contingencies
Demolition*	Landscaping - Seeding, sod, trees, etc.

*Only when required to implement the RAP



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Previously Incurred Costs

- Investigation Grant
 - Recent and reasonable

Cleanup Grants

 Funds incurred prior to award date must have been incurred after RAP approval and the RAP approval date must be within 180 days of application due date



Maximum Grant Awards

- Up to 75% of eligible cleanup and investigation costs
- Maximum of \$50,000 for investigation grants
- Of the 25% match, an amount equivalent to 12% of cleanup costs must come from an unrestricted source
- Ask for what you need



Funds Available

\$4,000,000 per cycle



\$250,000 investigation maximum

35% Greater Minnesota statute



Competitive Grants

- Both Cleanup and Investigation grants are competitive
- Compete against other applications (no thresholds)



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
Competitive Scoring Categories

- Increase in tax base (25 points)
- Add social value (65 points)
- Reduce or eliminate health threats (25 points)
- Funding need (20 points)
- Cleanup cost (10 points)
- Commitment of local match (5 points)



Minimum Score


• Total points available = 150



 Applications must score at least 50 points to be eligible for funding



Unique and Different



•Variety of projects have been funded

- Sites from .09 235 acres
- Between 4 and 1000's Housing Units

 New commercial, industrial, housing and expansion of existing businesses

Applications are due on May 1 and November 1 by 4:00 pm to DEED offices

 Grant terms are for two years and are difficult to extend

- Complete applications thoroughly by due date:
 - All questions answered
 - All attachments submitted (RAP approval, appraisals, Resolutions, etc.)
 - Closed Process
- Only Assessor or Appraiser can determine contaminated value
- Acquisition costs will only be considered in public transactions
- Use Updated Application form
- Make sure your project qualifies before submitting

Eligible Sites

- Completed All Appropriate Inquiries
- Own or have access to property
- MPCA-approved RAP
- Applicant cannot be responsible for contamination
- Have ability to repay loan

Previously Incurred Costs

 Costs already incurred are not eligible for loan funds

 Cleanup costs only eligible after project is determined to be eligible and plan is approved by appropriate agencies



Other Loan Information

- Generally takes a minimum of 90 days to complete loan process
- Rates and term are negotiable
- Public Comment Period for each loan project



Maximum Loan Awards

- Up to 78% of eligible cleanup costs
- 22% local match must come from a non-Federal source

Hazardous Substance: \$1,500,000

Petroleum: \$2,000,000

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Cleanup Program Successes

- First grant awarded in 1995 and first loan awarded in 2004
- Over \$3 million in 99 INVESTIGATION grants
- Over \$111 million in 204 CLEANUP grants
- Approximately \$2.1 million in LOAN funds

Program Results

- 3,030 <u>acres</u> cleaned or investigated
- 34,411 new jobs created or jobs retained
- 12,477 housing units developed
- \$76.6 million in tax base increases
- Over \$3 billion in non-state funds
 <u>leveraged</u>




Redevelopment Grant Program and Demolition Loan Program





Eligible Applicants

- Cities
- Counties
- HRAs
- EDAs
- Port Authorities





Eligible Sites

- Previously been developed
- End use which will create jobs, taxes, or other public benefits
- Must have public component
- Resolution from applicant body and municipality (if different)



Eligible Costs

Eligible Costs	Ineligible Costs
Acquisition	Project/Grant Administration
Infrastructure Improvements	Appraisal or other application costs
Soil Stabilization	Development Costs
Demolition	Environmental Remediation
Ponding or other Environmental Infrastructure	Contingencies
Interior Remediation for Re-use	Streetscape - Landscaping, benches, planters, etc.



Previously Incurred Costs

• Eligible costs are those incurred after grant award date

 Eligible costs incurred up to 12 months prior to application due date can be eligible as <u>match</u>



Match Requirement

- Up to 50% of eligible redevelopment costs
- Match can be from any available source
- Eligible activities performed on private portion of the site are eligible as match



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Competitive Grants

- Grants are competitive
- Compete against other applications (no thresholds)





Competitive Scoring Categories

- Contamination remediation need (15 points)
- Qualifies and uses TIF (25 points)
- Redevelopment potential (85 points)
- Proximity to public transit (5 points)
- Multi-jurisdictional projects that take into account affordable housing, transportation and environmental impact (10 points)
- Bioscience/green economy (10 points)



Minimum Score

• Total points available = 150

• Applications must score at least 50 points to be eligible for funding



Project Readiness

Apply when project is ready

 Projects must begin by date listed in grant agreement – generally within 9 months of award

 Grant terms are extremely difficult to extend



Ownership Issues

Grantee must be the owner of the public property and the infrastructure or public facility.



A Note on State Funds

 Public funds are subject to numerous requirements. Please contact your city attorney for assistance with specific requirements.

• Bond funds are complicated and are not a good fit for every project.

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Awarding Grants

• Grants are generally awarded approximately 6-8 weeks after submittal.

Redevelopment Program Successes

- First grant awarded in 1998
- Over \$59.7 million in over 140 Redevelopment grants

Program Results

- 1190 <u>acres</u> redeveloped
- 19209 new jobs created or jobs retained
- 4,403 housing units developed
- \$24.2 million in <u>tax base</u> increases
- \$1.7 billion in non-state funds leveraged



Demolition Loan Program



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Eligible Criteria

- Same eligible applicants as Redevelopment Grants
- Eligible sites must be owned by the applicant, must have been vacant for at least one year and cannot be listed on the National Register of Historic Places
- Eligible costs include demolition and interior remediation
- Same application deadlines as Redevelopment Grants
- Doesn't have to be imminent development prospect




Other Loan Information

- May pay up to 100% of costs, maximum loan amount of \$1,000,000
- 2% interest rate for up to 15 years
- Interest free for first two years
- If development occurs, up to 50% of the remaining principal and interest could be forgiven based on development benefits
