Welcome, Introductions, & Opening Remarks

- Larry Erickson opened the meeting and welcomed everyone.

Agenda Review

- The participants reviewed the tentative agenda and concurred on its content.

KSU Sustainability

- Larry Erickson briefly shared an overview, noting that planning continues for the January 23, 2009 "Leading Kansas in Sustainability" conference, K-State Union <http://sustainability.k-state.edu/conferences/leadingkansas/>
- A call for presentations was recently issued and several CESAS partners plan to submit abstracts. Generally, the conference program will include a morning session featuring internal K-State activities and afternoon tracks addressing broader Kansas challenges.
- K-State Stewardship Subcommittee met earlier on Tuesday, September 18, and is working to advance sustainability and may form a task force.

PEW Charitable Trust Initiative

- CESAS partners are working on preliminary ideas (public education for sustainability) and crafting a white paper for proposal, led by Wendy Griswold.
- Proposed topics and activities include: climate change, public education, workshops, seminars, grants, community development, public policy, etc.
- The next working group meeting will be Thursday, September 25, 9:00 AM, Ward 102.
- Valerie Carroll and Ken Barnard expressed an interest in participating.

Student Sustainability Activities

- Various activities are planned, including recycling at football games. Cynthia Annett and Laura Calwell suggested students explore partnership with the Bridging the Gap organization to leverage experience with large events <http://www.bridgingthegap.org/index.php>

- Ken Barnard noted that some of his Salina-area students were interested in collaborating on an engineering research project; groups like Engineers Without Borders and Emerging Green Builders were recommended as potential groups to contact.

Targeted Excellence Pre-proposals

- Targeted Excellence request for proposals for 2008-2009 is posted on the KSU Provost's website.
- Groups can request up to \$1 million over one-to-four years.

- Lisa Harrington plans to resubmit the "Program in Rural Systems Sustainability" proposal.
- Ronaldo Maghirang has developed an agriculture and air quality proposal.
- Ruth Miller proposed the idea of developing a program focused on wind energy to support robust activities involving the wind turbine donated by Westar Energy to K-State. Group brainstormed ideas and opportunities, including: science-technology learning tool, land use planning, community education, and important social justice dimensions. The investment could be used to support job creation in Kansas and may fit with the PEW proposal.
- Preproposals are due Monday, September 29, 2008.
- The success of the Wind Energy Exhibit featured at the Kansas State Fair and supported by several companies, citizen groups, and government leaders, including Gov. Sebelius, was discussed.

4-H Initiative

- Gary Gerhard updated the group on a broad based proposal to create an innovative 4-H curriculum, "engineering for sustainability" for middle and high-school students. The comprehensive effort will also include socioeconomic and life-skill enhancement elements.
- Laura Calwell noted that Friends of the Kaw recently received an EPA grant for environmental/water education for children and Cynthia Annett mentioned an environmental justice proposal examining water impacts and coal plants.
- The importance of water and energy related impacts to river resources was discussed and Ruth Miller noted an NREL recent webinar on electricity and water in the Arkansas River valley http://www.eere.energy.gov/windandhydro/windpoweringamerica/filter_detail.asp?itemid=1957

Association for the Advancement of Sustainability in Higher Education (AASHE)

- Larry Erickson noted the upcoming AASHE conference in Raleigh, NC, November 9-11, 2008 <http://www.aashe.org/index.php>
- K-State recently joined the organization and some members of the Stewardship Subcommittee plan to attend. AASHE was instrumental in getting the Higher Education Sustainability Act (HESA) passed by Congress.
- Financial appropriations in support of HESA, including grants to universities, will facilitate campus collaborations and partnerships.

- Rhonda Janke shared information with respect to visiting scholar Isidor Wallimann and his upcoming presentation, *Beyond Global Warming: Downscaling Industrial Society and Its Challenges*, Thursday, September 25, 4:00 PM, Throckmorton 1021
